Superintendent's Corner

What a Blowout! The 41st Annual Blowout was a hot one and from past stories I have heard, it beats rain. The course held up well to the traffic over the three day tournament. I would like to thank my crew for their hard work. They really do care about this place and want the best conditions possible. I would also like to congratulate the winners and thank the losers for coming out.

The greens will be a touch slower going forward. With us hand watering daily they will be softer and wetter. We will continue to topdress and roll minimizing some of the softness. I know you all love the super tall grass around the bunkers but we will begin keeping it a lower height. It will still be a penalty but it will look more maintained. With us hand watering we have had some irrigation leaks pop up here and there. The crew will begin addressing those in the coming week. The cause of so many leaks all at once was a minor pump station issue. It also will be resolved soon.

As you play you will notice some areas that are un-mowed. These are native areas. We will mow them once a year so they don't just go crazy but they will be tall and you might not find your ball in there. These designated areas will allow for natural habitats and make golfers play holes the way they were designed to be played.

Thank you all for your support of our golf club and I can't wait to see you out on the course.

TIPS FROM THE PROS

On anything that is less than a full swing, we need to learn how to match the backswing and follow through. Nearly everyone we work with will make a backswing that is too short for the desired shot and attempt to make up for this short backswing by stomping on the gas pedal, praying for solid contact and hoping to not fire a Nolan Ryan fastball across the green.

Hitting quality chips, pitches and putts is centered around rhythm. If a player has good rhythm the backswing length will mirror the follow through length. i.e. if the club head swings back to 9 o'clock, the finish should be no longer than 3 o'clock. I would even prefer the follow through to be shorter than the backswing as long as the chest continues to rotate.

By practicing your rhythm and swing lengths, you will create better and more consistent contact while watching the ball land like a butterfly with sore feet.
